#### Hello DDRC Community,

We are honored to play a crucial role in the lives of so many people! With staff, friends and partners by our side, we have faced the challenges and opportunities presented in 2022, and our Board of Directors have been the cornerstone of our resilience, providing wisdom, countless volunteer hours, and stewardship.





All this support has been instrumental in helping us fulfill our mission of providing meaningful, lifechanging opportunities for the approximately 4,700 children and adults we serve according to their choice and needs - from intermittent support to intensive care, often over their lifetime.

With the pandemic waning, we are relieved that COVID protocols are no longer a requirement for the majority of our services. In response to COVID, we implemented telehealth and virtual services and have continued with many of these approaches, as they are beneficial, convenient, and efficient, and they are a strategic workforce recruitment and retention tool. A sincere thank you to all who weathered these various changes with patience and grace.

Workforce shortages continue to be a huge challenge across most of the country. Using new federal and state dollars, DDRC's Board of Directors made significant investments in compensation and benefits to recruit and retain a quality workforce. We have continued our efforts around diversity, equity and inclusion to demonstrate our commitment to inclusion for all.

The "Scope & Reach" section of this annual report gives highlights of our resource coordination/case management and direct services; their growth and successes. Additionally, our Adult Vocational and Employment Services have received national and state recognition for their transformational service delivery in disability employment services. We also have exciting plans to expand our Behavioral Health and Housing services in 2023.

Legislation changed where Early Intervention Evaluations, formerly known as Child Find, are performed. We are proud to report that DDRC was successfully awarded the state contract for Early Intervention Evaluations for our community, enabling us to provide more coordinated, streamlined access to Early Intervention service delivery to more children and families.

We are also facing significant transformation with the upcoming mandates relating to Case Management Re-Design (CMRD), which will impact all long-term supports and services, including Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.

DDRC is forever indebted for the incredible leadership of David Pemberton as our longtime Board President. His dedication, insight and thoughtfulness has been absolutely invaluable! We are grateful he will continue serving on the board, and both he and I are excited to continue to work with Susan Hartley, incoming Board President, and all the Board of Directors, in 2023.

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CMRD impacts all Community Centered Boards, like DDRC, and Single-Entry Points. Ultimately, it will create one entity in our community to provide case management for all long term supports and services. It will define new service areas, the rates paid for these services and how these services may be provided. These changes will not take full effect until July 1, 2024, but their magnitude requires ongoing planning and preparation to address and implement.

As we steer through this transition, our goal is to minimize the impact this will have on all individuals and families served by DDRC, those who might access our services in the future, and our dedicated employees. We are committed to making a positive difference for those individuals and families who rely on DDRC now and in the future. That has been the mission of DDRC for nearly 60 years, and we will continue to create opportunities for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families to participate fully in the community. Together, we will thrive.

This year also saw transitions in our Board Officers. After 18 years, David Pemberton is stepping down as Board President while continuing to serve on the board. We are excited to welcome and work with Susan Hartley, long time board member and former Treasurer, as the incoming Board President in 2023, and all of the Board of Directors who continue to provide such a valuable service! 

## Scope & Reach Of DDRC

DDRC serves people of all ages in so many ways. Here are just some of those ways, and the extent of our reach benefiting individuals and their families during 2022.

**4,700+** children and adults, and their families, served in 2022, from intermittent support to intensive care. **300+** full-time employees.

Hundreds of thousands of hours of resource coordination and direct services were provided in 2022. **88%+** of every dollar went to services and programs.

**\$6,200** provided by our Developmental Disabilities Foundation to assist vulnerable individuals with unanticipated, emergency hardships.

**125**% of our fundraising and development goals achieved, helping to enhance the services we are able to provide.





**1,200** babies, toddlers and their families served each month through Early Intervention services. **100** additional babies and toddlers served each month this year due to new streamlined Early Interventions Evaluations.


**13** Early Intervention DDRC team members completed the year-long DDRC BABIES Learning Collaborative enabling faster and more effective support to medically fragile infants and their caregivers.

**100**% increase in the number of individuals and families served under our Quality Living Options family care giver model, which is one of the most person-centered residential service options.

**20+** additional individuals entered or advanced in the workforce in 2022 with DDRC Employment Services support, working in many different industries and roles, to gain inclusion, greater financial flexibility and fulfillment.

**80+** people with disabilities were actively supported in 2022 by DDRC's Employment Services.

2 DDRC Employment Support Services staff were honored to present at the 2022 National Employment First Conference.



**120** people assisted by our Resource Coordination team to access in crucial, residential services from the waitlist.

**200** additional people assisted by Resource Coordination to access other waiver services. 800+ people are waiting for residential services. DDRC will continue to work diligently with our legislators on initiatives and funding to reduce and end the long wait list for residential services.

**1,000+** women and men participated in social /learning activities of their choice through DDRC Therapeutic Learning Connections (TLC) / Recreation, with 23+ activity choices per month, providing benefits of life skills learning, health, fitness, and social connections.

**65+** athletes and 29 unified partners (without disabilities) participated in 10 Special Olympic Sports, supported by TLC/ Rec, involving 4-6 weeks of training and competition in both regional and state meets.
