

GETTING STARTED

To find out if you are eligible for our services, contact a Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Office by viewing the contact info on the back page. You can then apply for services and work with your counselor to gather the information necessary to determine your eligibility.

To be eligible for services

- You must have a documented, disability -(physical, mental, or learning disability)
- Your disability must create a barrier for getting, performing, keeping, or advancing in a job
- You must need DVR services to work successfully
